1. Set up a learning environment

To join an online class or video meeting in Teams and access Teams chats, files, and assignments from anywhere at anytime, your students will need a computer, tablet, or smartphone.

Reading Progress and Reading Coach

Reading Progress and Reading Coach can be found in Microsoft Teams for Education and have been created to help students practice and develop their reading fluency through individualized literacy instruction.

- Enable students to independently complete their reading assignments
- Assign passages to the class as a whole or select specific passages for certain students
- Use the auto-detect tool with adjustable pronunciation sensitivity
- Create challenge words practice activities based on each student's individual trends
- Monitor student and class progress automatically through Education Insights

Reflect in Microsoft Teams

Reflect in Microsoft Teams for Education is an emotional check-in app that helps educators support their students. Through the app, students build skills to recognize and navigate their emotions with regular opportunities to share and be heard.

- Provide a space for feelings and emotions
- Bring emotions to life with the animated Feelings Monster
- Build self-awareness and empathy
- Develop emotional granularity by expanding emotional vocabulary

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Did you know?

Speaker Coach

Speaker Coach, found within Teams for Education meetings and PowerPoint presentations, provides students with real-time, individualized feedback on their public speaking skills.

- Develop future ready public speaking skills anytime or anywhere
- Receive immediate feedback and coaching
- Improve in areas such as filler words, repetition, reading from the screen, and inclusiveness

- Develop vital information literacy skills
- Receive feedback and suggestions based on individual search tendencies
- Filter for certain domains, file types, or operators
- Encounter powerful tools like <u>NewsGuard</u> to assess a site's reliability
